

High Risk Entry Controller

City & Guilds Level 3 Award 6160-04

Who Should Attend:

This unit is for the entry controller/top person who controls entry and arrangements for High Risk confined spaces **without entering them**. It includes the duties of an entry controller, pre-entry procedures, entry into and exit from the confined space, maintaining communications and initiating and controlling emergency procedures.

Pre-Requisites or APL:

- ✧ Stand-alone course with no prerequisites

Requirements:

- ✧ Fit for operational duties
- ✧ Physical fitness for potentially strenuous training

Aim:

The aim of this unit is to reflect the national occupational standard for controlling entry and arrangements at a high risk confined space. This unit covers both the water and non-water industry areas.

Outcomes:

On successful completion of the course, the student will have demonstrated their competence, knowledge and skills enabling them to meet the City & Guilds requirements to:

- ✧ Implement procedures for teams working in confined spaces
- ✧ Control safe entry and exit of the confined space
- ✧ Monitor the work team to ensure procedures are followed
- ✧ Control emergency situations
- ✧ Understand health and safety and environmental legislation
- ✧ Understand standard protocols for work in confined spaces
- ✧ Understand entry controller duties & responsibilities
- ✧ Understand equipment checks and testing required

Additionally, Outreach Rescue ensures the following subjects are covered on this course:

- ✧ Identification of Confined Spaces
- ✧ Atmospheric monitoring
- ✧ Legislative requirements
- ✧ Ventilation
- ✧ Rescue plans
- ✧ Pre-use checks and operation of vertical entry equipment (winches, tripod, harness use, fall arrest devices)

The following equipment is covered in detail enough so that an entry controller can perform necessary pre-use checks, but would **not be qualified to use themselves**:

- ✧ Emergency breathing apparatus
- ✧ Self-contained breathing apparatus

Compliance:

- ✧ Confined Space Regulations 1997

- ✧ National Occupational Standards for Working in Confined Spaces – EUSCS04

Duration:

3 days with 24 hours contact time

Ratios:

Trainers 1:6 Students

Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work, practical sessions, scenarios.

Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included. You can provide your own PPE provided it is serviceable and subject to inspection by our trainers.

You are expected to bring the following:

Overalls, Safety boots (non-slip, toe capped), Gloves (can be provided), Comfortable and suitably warm & weatherproof clothing.

Assessment:

Course content is assessed by a combination of direct observations of set tasks, question and answer, a short answer externally set exam and scenario based assessment. Individual feedback is provided.

Certification:

This course can be certified by City & Guilds or by Outreach Rescue upon meeting the assessment criteria. For City & Guilds certification, there is an additional fee of £45, and printed certificates are provided. There is no additional fee for digital Outreach Certification, and results are recorded on the Outreach Rescue Database.

Certification is valid for 3 years.

Progression:

Recertification is recommended every 2 years.

This course is not a prerequisite for any higher awards in Confined Space working.
