High Risk Entry Controller for Existing Qualified Entrants

City & Guilds Level 3 Award 6160-04

Who Should Attend:

This course is a shortened version of the 3 day High Risk Entry Controller course for those who hold an in-date High Risk entry award. Once complete, a High Risk entrant can work as the entry controller/top person who controls entry and arrangements for High Risk confined spaces without entering them. It includes the duties of an entry controller, pre-entry procedures, entry into and exit from the confined space, maintaining communications and initiating and controlling emergency procedures.

Pre-Requisites or APL:

 In-date City & Guilds High Risk entry award 6160-03 (within 3 years)

Requirements:

- Provide evidence of in-date High Risk Entry Award
- 🧚 Fit for operational duties
- Physical fitness for potentially strenuous training

Aim:

The aim of this unit is to reflect the national occupational standard for controlling entry and arrangements at a high risk confined space. This unit covers both the water and non-water industry areas.

Outcomes:

On successful completion of the course, the student will have demonstrated their competence, knowledge and skills enabling them to meet the City & Guilds requirements to:

- Implement procedures for teams working in confined spaces
- Control safe entry and exit of the confined space
- Monitor the work team to ensure procedures are followed
- Control emergency situations
- Understand health and safety and environmental legislation
- Understand standard protocols for work in confined spaces
- Understand entry controller duties & responsibilities
- Understand equipment checks and testing required

Compliance:

- Confined Space Regulations 1997
- National Occupational Standards for Working in Confined Spaces – EUSCS04

Duration:

1 day with 8 hours contact time

Ratios:

Trainers 1:6 Students

Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work, practical sessions, scenarios.

Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included. You can provide your own PPE provided it is serviceable and subject to inspection by our trainers.

You are expected to bring the following:

Overalls, Safety boots (non-slip, toe capped), Gloves (can be provided), Comfortable and suitably warm & weatherproof clothing.

Assessment:

Course content is assessed by a combination of direct observations of set tasks, question and answer, a short answer externally set exam and scenario based assessment. Individual feedback is provided.

Certification:

This course can be certified by City & Guilds or by Outreach Rescue upon meeting the assessment criteria. For City & Guilds certification, there is an additional fee of £45, and printed certificates are provided. There is no additional fee for digital Outreach Certification, and results are recorded on the Outreach Rescue Database.

Certification is valid for 3 years.

Progression:

Recertification is recommended every 2 years. This course is not a prerequisite for any higher awards in Confined Space working.
