Confined Space Instructor

Training and Assessment

Who Should Attend:

This course is for emergency service personnel who are experienced in Confined Space working and Rescue, who wish to train others in safe Confined Space entry and Confined Space rescue techniques.

Pre-Requisites or APL:

- High Risk Confined Space entry award (City & Guilds 6160-03 or equivalent 3 day training)
- Member of a Rescue and Recovery Team (City and Guilds 6160-08 or equivalent 3 day training)
- At least one of the above must have been renewed or gained within the last 3 years

Requirements:

- Aptitude for working in confined spaces
- Aptitude for training others
- Fit for operational duties
- Physical fitness for strenuous training
- Clean shaven each morning of training

Aim:

To broaden working knowledge of working in confined spaces, including rescues from confined spaces, and to develop teaching methodology to impart this knowledge to others.

Outcomes:

On successful completion of the course, the student will have demonstrated their competence, knowledge and skills enabling them to:

- Demonstrate best practice for working in high risk confined spaces
- Assess hazards associated with training in confined space venues, and mitigate these training hazards appropriately
- Demonstrate effective teaching techniques in confined space training
- Demonstrate effective use of assessment methods to ascertain competence of confined space workers
- Demonstrate understanding of legislative requirements relevant to confined space work and training
- Demonstrate safe application of All specialist equipment associated with confined space working, including breathing apparatus, winch systems, gas monitoring devices, PPE

Compliance:

- Confined Space Regulations 1997
- National Occupational Standards for Working in Confined Spaces – EUSCS03 & EUSC08

Duration:

5 days with 35 hours contact time

Ratios:

Trainers 1:6 Students

Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work, practical sessions, scenarios. A course manual is issued.

Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included. You can provide your own PPE provided it is serviceable and subject to inspection by our trainers.

You are expected to bring the following:

Overalls, Safety boots (non-slip, toe capped), Gloves (can be provided), Comfortable and suitably warm & weatherproof clothing and a laptop for classroom work and for the presentation task.

Assessment:

Course contents is assessed by means of direct observations of delegates delivery of teaching and assessing, written tasks (rescue plans, safe systems of work, risk assessments and lesson plans), delivery of a presentation and through continuous holistic assessment throughout the course.

Certification:

Students will receive a digital Outreach Rescue certificate of achievement upon meeting assessment criteria. Results are recorded on a personal record of performance and recorded on the Outreach Rescue Database.

Certification is valid for 3 years.

Progression:

Recertification is recommended every 2 years. It is expected that students maintain CPD in confined space rescue and working, and keep a log of training delivered.
