

WORK AT HEIGHT and ROPE RESCUE OPERATOR INSTRUCTOR - ASSESSMENT/REASSESSMENT

Who should attend?

Emergency Services personnel who require assessment / reassessment in Outreach Work at Height and Rope Rescue Operator Instructor.

Course/Programme Requirements

- Students must have successfully completed the Outreach Rope Instructor Training course within the previous 2 years with verified maintenance of skills.
- Compliance with Outreach Training Progression Policy. (see website for details)
- Be fit for full operational duties in accordance with organisation requirements.
- Have received training in Health and Safety at Work, including manual handling.

The module will involve students undertaking potentially strenuous training.

Personal equipment should include appropriate all weather outdoor clothing, footwear and gloves. All specialist equipment required is provided with the exception of gloves suitable for rope rescue. Service uniform is not required.

Aim

To assess the framework of core instructional skills and associated knowledge required to instruct others in the equivalent of Outreach Work at Height and Rope Rescue Operator.

Outcomes

On successful completion of the course, the student will have the knowledge and skills to-:

- Demonstrate the ability to plan, deliver, assess and review training events across a range of environments, covering topics within the Outreach Work at Height and Rope Rescue Operator syllabus.
- Undertake risk assessments and rescue plans for delivering the above in a range of teaching environments (built and natural).
- Understand skills maintenance and development issues.

- Apply knowledge of rescue PPE equipment, its use, care and maintenance.
- Rescue student in difficulty
- Supervise responses to a range of rope rescue situations.
- Practise different teaching and assessment methods suitable for a range of candidates' abilities.

Delivery Method

Practical exercises and scenarios.

Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

Core content is assessed by a combination of continuous, scenario based practical work, a presentation and written work to inform the student's development indicators.

Results centrally recorded and entered in a personal Record of Performance

Students will receive Outreach Rescue Certification upon successful completion. It is strongly recommended that a reassessment is completed within 2 years and that adequate skills maintenance will have been undertaken in the interim.
