

WORK at HEIGHT and ROPE RESCUE OPERATOR

Who should attend?

Emergency Services personnel involved with work at height and rope rescue, at operator level.

Course/Programme Requirements

Owing to the nature of the training, students must:

- Be fit for full operational duties in accordance with Organisation requirements for this role.
- Have an indicated aptitude for working at height.
- Have received training in Health and Safety at Work, including manual handling.
 The module will involve students undertaking potentially strenuous training.

Personal equipment should include appropriate allweather outdoor clothing. All specialist equipment required is provided with the exception of gloves suitable for rope rescue. Service uniform is not required.

Aim

To enable students to act as competent, supervised operatives in work at height and rope rescue situations.

Learning Outcomes

On successful completion of the course, the student will have a foundation of knowledge and skills and be able to-

- Apply knowledge of rescue equipment, use, care, application and maintenance.
- Assess hazards associated with use of rope systems and create appropriate responses.
- Understand theory of fall prevention and hierarchy of safety systems,
- Demonstrate understanding of legal requirements and Health and Safety as applied to rope rescue situations including basic casualty care and skills maintenance.
- Demonstrate safe application of A range of technical rescue equipment and its application within the basic systems for rescue and twin line working Anchoring, belaying, abseiling, rope ascent, lowering, raising, and working on structures.

Delivery Method

By lectures, practical exercises and scenarios. A course manual is issued.

Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

Core content is assessed by a combination of continuous, scenario based and written assessment to inform the student's development indicators. Results centrally recorded and entered in a personal Record of Performance.

Students will receive Outreach Rescue Certification upon successful completion of the course.
