

Water & Flood Incident Manager Recertification DEFRA MOD 5 (WIM)

Who Should Attend:

This module is for personnel who require recertification of their Water and Flood Incident Commander award post-2019, and who have met recertification CPD prerequisites for both the 'Management' and the 'Water Safety' elements as defined in the DEFRA Flood Rescue Concept of Operations 2019 (pages 85-87).

Those holding a pre-2019 WIM should attend the WIM initial training to come into alignment with 2019 learning outcomes.

Pre-Requisites or APL:

See DEFRA Flood Rescue Concept of Operations document for CPD requirements for MOD 5 (page 85).

Requirements:

Record of CPD of operating as a WIM for 8 hours a year

PLUS one of the following three to satisfy the 'Water Safety' element of the WIM recert:

Maintain MOD 2 or MOD 3 award

OR

Maintain MOD 1 award with 4 hours in class 2 water as CPD every 3 years with a MOD 2 or 3 instructor, meeting the requirements on page 86 of the 2019 DEFRA Con-Ops

OR

Attend the Mod 1 with Annex H 1 day course with Outreach Rescue to satisfy the above.

Aim:

To assess the competency of commanders to identify, select, develop and manage appropriate tactical and operational plans in water and flood environments.

Outcomes:

After successful completion of the course, the student will have a firm foundation of knowledge and should be able to meet the learning outcomes within the DEFRA Flood Rescue Concept of Operations for training Module 5.

Compliance:

DEFRA Module 5 (post-2019)

Duration:

2 days with 14 hours contact time

Ratios:

Trainers 1:12 Students

Delivery Method:

This course has on-line training materials, including precourse reading and a knowledge confirmation test which is part of the overall assessment process. Training is delivered through classroom lectures, presentations and table-top exercises. The course utilises recent case studies and full training notes are issued.

Equipment:

This course is predominantly classroom based and no specialist equipment is required. It is advised to bring a laptop.

Assessment:

Course content is assessed through a combination of practical and written assessment and through personal reflection throughout the course. Individual feedback is provided.

Certification:

Students will receive a digital Outreach Rescue certificate of achievement upon meeting assessment criteria. Results are recorded on a personal record of performance and recorded on the Outreach Rescue Database.

Certification is valid for 3 years.

Progression:

Reassessment is recommended every 3 years.

Venue:

This course can be delivered at any premises with good classroom facilities.
